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2	MR. BRAUN: We'll open up the meeting
3	for the Local Development Corporation.
4	It is Wednesday, February 10th. It is
5	now 10:04.
6	The minutes of our meeting of
7	January 20th have been sent to everybody.
8	I'll accept a motion to accept those minutes.
9	MR. TROTTA: Motion.
10	MR. POLLAKUSKY: Second.
11	MR. BRAUN: On the vote, Mr. Grucci?
12	MR. GRUCCI: Yes.
13	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan?
14	MR. CALLAHAN: Yes.
15	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Pollakusky?
16	MR. POLLAKUSKY: Yes.
17	MR. BRAUN: Skip Ms. Scheidt for now.
18	Mr. Trotta?
19	MR. TROTTA: Yes.
20	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Braun votes yes.
21	Motion carries.
22	Lori, I'll turn it over to you for the
23	CFO report.

MS. LaPONTE: Sure.

So the statements are not fully

2	completed for January, so I just want to give
3	you an update on the status of our year-end
1	audit and PARIS completion for the LDC.

The audit field work has been completed, so we're waiting for drafts.

There's one or two open items, confirms, that we're waiting for, but most everything that they have asked for, we have provided them.

We're expecting to get a draft in the next week and expecting to have some preliminary meetings with the committees just to review them.

That's the audit and PARIS update. The information has already been entered and updated in PARIS, so it's just a matter of pressing the button once we get everything finalized and approved.

The other item on the CFO's report is the state comptroller audit. As you're aware, we received a notification back in January that we were selected for an audit from the New York State OSC. We have not heard any secondary communication back from them.

We did make contact, Lisa and I, with

2	Town of Hempstead, who's currently having an
3	LDC audit by the New York State OSC. They
4	gave us some highlights of what they're
5	looking at; again, open ended, it's not
6	completed and their thoughts are once they
7	finish with Hempstead, they will be contacting
8	us.
9	Any questions?
10	MR. BRAUN: Lori, two questions.
11	When did Hempstead's audit start, do we
12	know?
13	MS. LaPONTE: I believe in January,
14	also.
15	MR. BRAUN: Okay.
16	MR. WEIR: I think they were notified
17	in end of December and then the audit started
18	in January.
19	MS. LaPONTE: Okay. Thank you, Bill.
20	MR. BRAUN: Lori, I know you and Lisa
21	have had conversations with the auditors; is
22	there a possibility we'll have a draft for our
23	meeting next week?
24	MS. LaPONTE: That is what we have been

asking for. No confirmation.

MR.	BRAUN:	Okay.
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- MS. LaPONTE: But as far as I'm
- 4 concerned, everything -- I've given them
- 5 everything, so nothing should hold back; you
- know, there's one or two confirms, but all the
- 7 number information's been provided and
- 8 audited, no questions.
- 9 MR. BRAUN: Thank you.
- Any questions for Lori?
- (No response.)
- MR. BRAUN: Need a motion to accept her
- report.
- MR. GRUCCI: So moved.
- MR. POLLAKUSKY: Seconded.
- MR. BRAUN: On the vote, Mr. Grucci?
- MR. GRUCCI: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan?
- MR. CALLAHAN: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: Mr. Pollakusky?
- MR. POLLAKUSKY: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: Mr. Trotta?
- MR. TROTTA: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: And Mr. Braun votes yes.
- Lisa, I think you're muted.

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2	MS. MULLIGAN: Okay. Sorry, I was
3	having some technical issues.
4	Annette is having some trouble getting
5	in and she just asked okay, I just sent
6	her the log-in stuff, she's having some issues
7	and when we send out the calendar invites,
8	let's update them with the log-in information
9	as soon as we have it so that everybody has it
10	in one place to try and find it. It is always
11	available on our website; Annette can't hear
12	me saying this right now, but I just sent her
13	the link to the website, just so everybody
14	knows.
15	MR. POLLAKUSKY: I think that if the
16	calendar invite has the link, that makes it a
17	lot easier because otherwise you're routing
18	through email.
19	MS. MULLIGAN: Yup, I agree a hundred
20	percent and Annette's email has just gone
21	down, so she's going to join us.
22	MR. WEIR: It's also helpful, though,
23	when Joce includes it, when she sends out the

agenda with the full package, she always

includes the link as well and that's always

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2	helpful.
3	MS. MULLIGAN: Yup. Because it's all
4	in one place.
5	I'm not sure what it takes to go back
6	into the calendar invite and insert it, but
7	we'll try. It's always a work in progress.
8	MS. LINSE: We can do that.
9	MS. MULLIGAN: All right. Annette's
10	having
11	MR. POLLAKUSKY: It just goes into the
12	notes, that's all.
13	MS. MULLIGAN: Okay. All right, good.
1 4	So that's you know, we try and
15	clean things up as we can.
16	Okay. So we have a couple of things or
17	the agenda, a couple of resolutions. I want
18	to just take one thing out of order.
19	Included in your packets was a letter
2 0	that we received from Scott Middleton
21	resigning from the board. So it's included in

your packets. I just wanted to let you know.

vote on that, do they need to take any action

or is that just a matter of information?

I don't know, does the board need to

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2	MR. WEIR: Just a matter of
3	information.
4	MS. MULLIGAN: Okay. Okay.
5	So Scott, the letter's in there, he
6	thanked everybody and expressed his
7	appreciation for his time on the board, but
8	explained that he has work responsibilities
9	that are making staying on the boards not
10	feasible for him right now.
11	MR. BRAUN: The question that may be on
12	some people's minds is whether or not the
13	board has contacted any of us or me with
14	regard to a replacement for Scott. The answer
15	is no. I don't know where they stand on
16	potential candidates and we'll fill you in as
17	soon as we know.
18	MS. MULLIGAN: Yes and I know that
19	senior staff had a meeting, I want to say two
20	weeks ago and it was on the agenda, so they're
21	definitely thinking about it and I just
22	touched base with Annette about it the other
23	day. She said that there hadn't been any
2 4	movement that she was aware of, but she's
25	keeping an eye on it and she'll let us know

2	and if she were on here she might be able to
3	give us an update, I'm getting texts that
4	she's trying to join the meeting, but she's
5	have some I think there must be some
6	computer issues at Town Hall because she said
7	other people in her office are having problems
8	participating in Zoom.
9	MR. GRUCCI: How many board members do
10	we have currently with Scott missing?
11	MR. BRAUN: Six. We're authorized for
12	seven. I know there are other IDA's around
13	the state that have more, but current
14	authorization is for seven.
15	MR. GRUCCI: Is it a majority of the
16	quorum or a majority of the board for a vote?
17	MR. BRAUN: Bill, Howard?
18	MR. WEIR: You need four members to
19	have a quorum and four members need to vote
20	affirmatively for a project for a
21	resolution.
22	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
23	MR. WEIR: So if you have four members
24	present, that's a quorum and there's a vote
25	that's three to one in favor of it, by law the

2	motion does not pass.
3	That's different from say a
4	not-for-profit corporation, but for
5	under state for laws for public authorities
6	and General Municipal Law, you need a
7	majority of the board has to vote for
8	something and a majority of the board is also
9	needed for a quorum.
10	MR. GRUCCI: Thanks, Bill.
11	MR. BRAUN: Hello, Annette.
12	MS. EADERESTO: Hi. I finally got on.
13	MS. MULLIGAN: Annette, we were just
14	discussing that Scott resigned and we have an
15	open seat on both the IDA and the LDC. Okay.
16	MR. BRAUN: Lisa, you have some
17	resolutions?
18	MS. MULLIGAN: I do have some
19	resolutions.
20	So the first resolution in your packets
21	is the appointment of officers. So since
22	Scott has resigned, Scott was our assistant
23	treasurer. The update to this is that I'm
2 4	going to remove Scott from this resolution and
25	I wanted to see if we wanted to put anyone in

2	his assistant treasurer's space, if we wanted
3	to leave that open, if we wanted to shuffle
4	anything.
5	MR. BRAUN: I promised Frank we'd find
6	a position for him, I think this is very
7	appropriate.
8	MR. TROTTA: Timing, last month you
9	asked and here it is. I'd rather have Scott
L 0	here.
11	MR. BRAUN: We would need a motion to
12	accept that and the change in the resolution.
13	MR. GRUCCI: So moved.
_ 4	MR. BRAUN: I call a vote.
15	MR. POLLAKUSKY: Second.
16	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Grucci?
17	MR. GRUCCI: Yes.
18	MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan?

2	MS. MULLIGAN: Thank you.
3	The next item on the agenda is an
4	update to our resolution number five, which is
5	the adoption of ethics, procurement, property
6	disposal, whistleblower and investment
7	policies.
8	What I'm suggesting is that
9	historically we have followed the Town's
10	ethics and procurement policies and Bill's
11	office has sent us some standalone just for
12	IDA's, it's some of the other IDA's around the
13	state use, Hempstead and Islip specifically
1 4	use these policies that we're looking at and
15	so what I'm suggesting is that we no longer
16	use the Town's ethics and procurement and
17	instead have our own.
18	MR. GRUCCI: Do these new ethics weaker
19	what the Town had or strengthen to what the
2 0	Town had?
21	MS. MULLIGAN: My perspective on it is
22	that it's not necessarily a weaken or a
23	strengthen, it's just cleaner for us. Rather

than us having a system where we're dependent

on let's say the Town Clerk, for instance, to

2	handle our ethics issues, we take it in-house.
3	MR. WEIR: However, this does not
4	excuse you from doing your financial
5	disclosures, you still have to do those.
6	MS. EADERESTO: Yeah, they have to go
7	to the County.
8	MS. MULLIGAN: Yeah.
9	MR. GRUCCI: Annette, you've seen the
10	new ethics proposal?
11	MS. EADERESTO: Yeah, I think it
12	just as Lisa was trying to say, it fits the
13	IDA a little bit better.
1 4	MR. GRUCCI: Okay.
15	MR. BRAUN: Annette, you started to say
16	something?
17	MR. GRUCCI: I'm sorry, the board's not
18	going to be accused of weakening the ethics of
19	the board by adopting this, would it?
2 0	MS. EADERESTO: No.
21	MR. GRUCCI: Thank you.
22	MS. EADERESTO: You're welcome.
23	MR. BRAUN: Annette, did I hear you to
2 4	say we still have to send to the Town the

conflict of interest policy?

- MS. EADERESTO: Yeah; to the County,
- 3 too, yup.
- 4 MR. BRAUN: I don't know that I've ever
- 5 sent it to the counties.
- MS. EADERESTO: Lisa, does it for you.
- 7 MR. BRAUN: Okay.
- 8 MS. MULLIGAN: You're talking about the
- 9 annual conflict of interest --
- MS. EADERESTO: Right.
- MS. MULLIGAN: -- forms.
- MR. BRAUN: Okay.
- On the resolution, a motion, please.
- MR. GRUCCI: So moved.
- MR. CALLAHAN: Second.
- MR. BRAUN: Call a vote.
- 17 Mr. Grucci?
- MR. GRUCCI: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: Mr. Callahan?
- MR. CALLAHAN: Yes.
- MR. BRAUN: Mr. Pollakusky?

14	MS. MULLIGAN: I think Gary was there
15	the other day, that's what I heard.
16	MR. BRAUN: Gary, you're muted.

18	MR. BRAUN: All right, we'll check back
19	with Gary then.
20	If there's no other business to be
21	brought before the Local Development
22	Corporation, take a motion to adjourn.
23	MR. CALLAHAN: So moved.
24	MR. BRAUN: Second?
